Blanchard stated that Pearl Street, which runs between Grand River and Eight Mile Road, is a county road and the county has jurisdiction. He stated, however, that several members of the Board would be willing to appear before the Road Commission, along with several residents of the street, to discuss the possibility of restricting the load limit.

Henry McCracken, Clerk, stated that 10 bids were received for the annual clean-up in the Township. The Board turned the matter of hiring personnel over to McCracken and Thomas Tardy. It was suggested that Clayton Geers handle the general area east of Orchard Lake Road and that personnel be secured as soon as possible to handle the area west of Orchard Lake Road.
