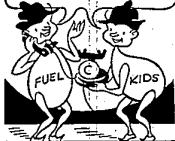

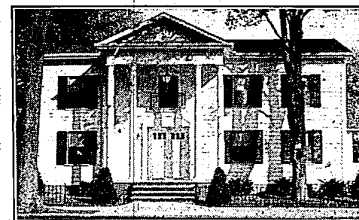

The Rebekahs held a luncheon at 12:30, followed by cards, at the hall on Friday, with a prize on each table. A nice crowd attended and a neat sum realized.



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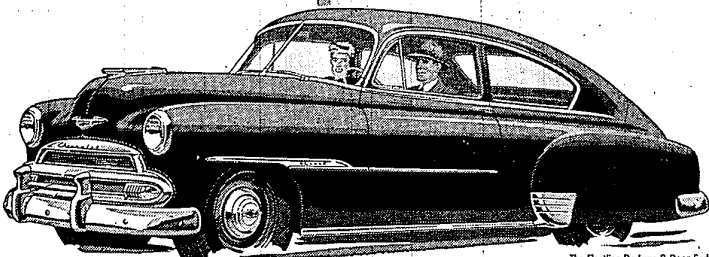
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
