The West Farmington 4 Fractional School, now a gas station and grocery owned and operated by Avery Aichevauser.

In warm weather, they met in the barn of Samuel Mead, situated at the corner of Haled and Howard roads, now owned by Leo McLean. It was much more convenient for the worshippers to attend local services than to travel by car to Pontiac, Michigan, a distance of 15 miles. Elder, Elkana Comstock was called annually and was given \$100 a year, one-third to be in cash, the rest in produce.



**Farm Bureau Women Plan Bazaar, Bake Sale**


