It shall be the duty of all police officers and they are hereby authorized and empowered, in the enforcement of this article, to comply with all provisions and precedure contained in Article XIV of said ordinance, and in the article herein enacted.

SECTION 100, PROCEDURE FOR IMPOUNDMENT OF VEHICLE. Any police officer may impound any motor vehicle parked at a place where parking is probiblied by this ordinance, or which has been parked for more than one hour in excess of the time allowed for parking in any place, or which has been involved in two or more vlotations of this ordinance, for which citation tags have been issued and not presented as required herein. Any person desiring to redeem such impounded vehicle shall first pay such fine or fines as may be assessed by the Judges of the Manticipal Court for the violation or vlotations for fines shall not exceed Fire (\$5.00) Dollars and Five (\$5.00) Dollars costs for each such offense.


