The Thirty Fifth Annual Meeting of the Michigan Milk Producers Association will be held in the Fairchild Theatre on the campus of Michigan State College, East Lansing, on Thursday, November 1, starting at 10:30 a.m. An estimated attendance of more than 500 guests and delegates from 33 counties in the state will attend the all-day session which will be presided over by President J. K. Maystead of Osceola.

The program calls for annual reports by the president, secretary manager H. F. Simmons, treasurer William C. Stilson and chairmen of committees.

Guest speakers include Tennyson Guyer of Findlay, Ohio, nationally known philosopher and humorist, and a representative of the American Dairy Farmers' Association to explain the dairy farmers' program of nationwide advertising.

Business will come before the delegates, includes the election of five directors to serve for three years and adoption of resolutions which will serve as instructions to the management in conducting Association affairs in the coming year.

### MSC Specialist Suggests Methods To Control Lice In Dairy Herds

A pre-winter treatment of cattle spoonful to 1 gallon of water. You for lice should be included on the schedule for a warm day in late October or any time during November.

Ray L. Janes, extension specialist in entomology at Michigan State College, says that the ideal time for treatment would be as late as possible in the season. But it should not be delayed so late that cold weather will prevent use of a spray.

For dairy animals James recommends using methoxychlor, at the rate of 8 pounds of the 50 percent wettable powder to 100 gallons of water or one level tablespoonful to a gallon of water.

Janes also pointed out that neither DDT nor lindane should be applied within 60 days of slaughter of any animal. Methoxychlor wettable powder may be used up to 30 days before slaughter.


