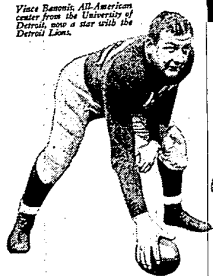

## CHILI para BANONIS

(An All-American Favorite)

1 1/2 lb. Bacon, diced  
1 large onion, chopped  
1 lb. ground beef  
1/2 tsp. chili powder  
1 tsp. salt  
cayenne pepper  
1 1/2 c. tomato juice  
1 1/2 c. tomato paste  
1 1/2 c. can red kidney beans  
1 1/2 c. can red kidney beans  
Put bacon in deep well cooker. Turn switch to high heat and fry bacon until grease covers bottom of cooker. Add onion and green pepper cook until onion turns yellow. Add ground beef and stir until meat has separated into small pieces. Heat and add chili powder, salt and cayenne pepper (to taste). Stir thoroughly. Add tomato juice and tomato paste. Cover. When steaming, turn switch to low heat and cook twenty minutes. Then add kidney beans and cook ten minutes longer. Serve hot.

## MICHIGAN MILK PRODUCERS TO HOLD ANNUAL MEETING

The Thirty-Fifth Annual Meeting of the Michigan Milk Producers Association will be held in the Fairchild Theatre on the campus of Michigan State College, East Lansing, on Thursday, November 1, starting at 10:00 in the morning. It is expected that more than 500 guests and delegates from 33 counties in the state will attend the all-day session which will be presided over by President I. K. Maystead of Oshtemo.

The program calls for annual reports by the president, secretary, manager H. F. Simmons, treasurer William Bristow and chairman of committees.

Guest speakers include Tennyson Guyer of Findlay, Ohio, nationally known philosopher and humorist, and a representative of the American Dairy Association to explain the dairy farmers' program of nationwide advertising and research. Business to come before the delegates includes the election of five directors to serve for three years, and adoption of resolutions which will serve as instructions to the management in conducting the Association affairs in the coming year. Luncheon will be served to the delegates and guests by the ladies of the People's Church.

## MSC Specialist Suggests Methods To Control Lice In Dairy Herds

A pre-winter treatment of cattle for lice should be included on the schedule for a warm day in late October or any time during November.

Ray L. James, extension specialist in entomology at Michigan State College, says that the ideal time for treatment would be as late as possible in the season. But it should not be delayed so late that cold weather will prevent use of a spray.

For dairy animals James recommends using methoxychlor at the rate of 8 pounds of the 50 per cent wettable powder to 100 gallons of water, or a level table-

## BEGIN PLANS FOR ANNUAL GRASS DAYS IN SPRING OF 1952

Grass Days will be held throughout Michigan again in June of 1952. It was announced this week by C. V. Ballard, director of the Michigan Cooperative Extension Service.

"The fourth annual series of events in 1951 attracted more than 14,000," reported Director Ballard. "In four years we have reached nearly 80,000 people in 31 different counties in lower Michigan and five in the Upper Peninsula. Interest in our program of good farming with good grasses and legumes has continued to increase. For that reason we have asked our state Grass Days committee to arrange another series of events for June of 1952."

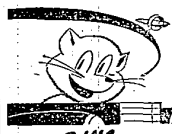
Richard Bell, farm crops extension specialist at Michigan State College, reports that plans are now being made for events in many localities.

## Warns Against Frozen Pasture Grasses

A word of caution about pasturing frozen sudan grass and alfalfa was given to farmers this week. Dr. Glen Reed, Michigan State College extension veterinarian, said that both are apt to cause bloat and may poison cattle. Chemists have reported a heavy prussic acid content in frozen sudan grass. Reed advised taking the cows off such pasture for a few days. If they are to be turned back on the pasture they should first get a full feed of hay or corn silage.

## Shear Lamb's Faces For Better Gains

Shearing the faces of heavily-wooled feeder lambs will increase gains, according to Graydon Blank, extension animal husbandry specialist at Michigan State College. Blank explained that lambs can see better without a heavy crop of wool around their eyes. After shearing they'll find the feed trough more quickly, will eat better and gain more rapidly.

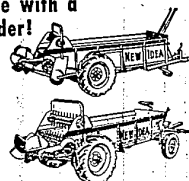

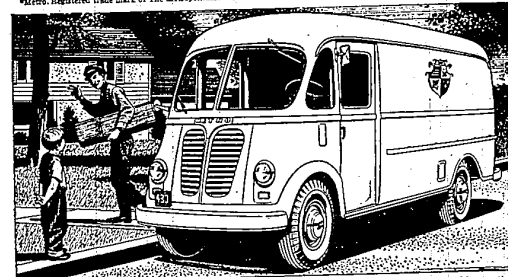

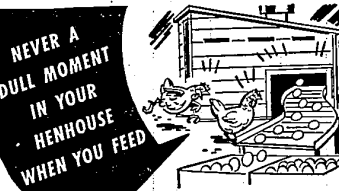
