BALANCED RATONS FOR DAIRY BULLS VITAL TO SUCCESS

Feeding bulls balanced rations is vital to good dairy breeding practices and profitable for dairymen.

As C. Baltzer, Michigan State College extension dairymen, says: "Baltzer supervises the feeding operation for 90 bulls owned by the Michigan Artificial Breeders Cooperative and has suggested as well as tested the diet plan."

He said that grain, alfalfa, steamed molasses, cobalt sulfate and roughage makes up the ration for the bulls. Each bull gets 20 pounds of hay, 12 pounds of alfalfa, 4 pounds of grain and 4 pounds of roughage.

The grain mixture is made up of 1,200 pounds of oats, 600 pounds of bran, 300 pounds of middlings, 200 pounds of corn, 200 pounds of meat scraps, 100 pounds each of linseed meal and cottonseed meal, 100 pounds of a high protein concentrate and 50 pounds of salt with cobalt sulfate.

Average weight of the Holstein bulls in the MABC bull stud is 2,183 pounds. Guernsey bulls weigh an average of 1,678, the Jersey bulls average 1,553 pounds, and the Red Danes average 1,834 pounds.

Baltzer said that dairymen should consider the weight of their cows as well as their milk production to feed most economically for best profits. A tape measure can be used to figure their weights and the MABC dairy extension office will furnish charts for feeding.

Winter Is Orchard Pruning Time

Winter is the season that orchardists begin their pruning operations. Apples, plums and pears can be pruned successfully in winter. Peaches and grapes are pruned in early spring, reports Wilfred E. Bosserman, assistant County Agricultural Agent.

Bearing fruit trees should be pruned regularly and lightly — a little every year or at least every other year. A common mistake is to neglect the trees for several years and then prune them too severely.

Vigorously growing trees should be pruned less severely than slowly growing trees. Old bearing trees usually need more pruning than young, vigorous trees that have just come into bearing.

Peaches, which bear their fruit in one-year-old twigs or shoots, need more pruning than other fruit trees which bear mostly on spurs found on wood two or more years old.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE TO BE ACTED ON BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON AT A SPECIAL MEETING TO BE HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING ON MONDAY, DECEMBER 3, 1951, AT 5 P.M.

ORDINANCE NO. C-25-51 CONSTRUCTION, REBUILDING AND REPAIR OF SIDEWALKS AND CROSSWALKS

The City of Farmington ordains: 1. That the owner or owners of real property within the City of Farmington shall be liable for the construction, rebuilding, repair and maintenance of sidewalks adjacent to and abutting upon the property of such owner or owners.

2. Sidewalks shall be built, rebuilt, repaired and maintained under the supervision of the City Manager, or such other official or employee as the Council may by resolution appoint, and such person is hereby authorized to determine the grade and material specifications of all sidewalks to be built, rebuilt and/or repaired and is also authorized to give all notices required to be given by any section of this ordinance.

3. Whenever a street or part of a street where there are no sidewalks or where the sidewalks are in poor condition, the Council shall be authorized to designate the outer edge of the sidewalk from the lot.

4. The City Manager, or other official designated by the Council, shall keep a record of all sidewalk lines and grades in a book prepared by the City Manager. A record shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk.

5. The Council may at any time, by resolution, require that sidewalks shall be constructed, rebuilt or repaired along either or both sides of any street or part of a street.

6. Such resolution shall specify the width of the sidewalk and width of any sidewalk to be constructed, rebuilt or repaired.

7. Within five (5) days after the passage and adoption of any resolution appointed under the provisions of Section 2 hereof shall give written notice of such resolution to the owner or owners of the lot or premises, as shown by the current tax roll of the City of Farmington, and abutting which the sidewalk is to be constructed, rebuilt or repaired, and such notice shall be in writing and shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk.

8. If the owner, owners or agent of any lot or premises shall refuse or neglect to build, rebuild or repair any sidewalk, in the manner and within the time prescribed by the Council, the Council may by resolution appoint an agent or employee appointed by the Council to be authorized to construct, rebuild or repair any sidewalk or part of a sidewalk, and the expense and cost of so doing shall be assessed to the person or persons who refuse or neglect to build, rebuild or repair the sidewalk, and the same shall be charged and assessed against such lot and/or premises.

9. It shall be the duty of the City Manager to make a complete and full report to the Council, within the time specified by the Council, as to the construction, rebuilding or repair of any sidewalk or part of a sidewalk, and the expense and cost of such construction, rebuilding or repairing, and the proportion of such expense and cost to be charged to each lot or premises.

10. The Council shall by resolution appoint a time at which it will hold a public hearing on the report of the City Manager, and the Council shall be authorized to make a complete and full report to the Council, within the time specified by the Council, as to the construction, rebuilding or repair of any sidewalk or part of a sidewalk, and the expense and cost of such construction, rebuilding or repairing, and the proportion of such expense and cost to be charged to each lot or premises.

11. At the time appointed for acting on the assessments above set forth, or at such subsequent time to which such action may be adjourned, the Council shall proceed by resolution to assess the lot, lots and/or premises adjacent to and abutting which any sidewalk shall have been constructed, rebuilt and/or repaired with the proper cost and expense thereof. All the assessments shall be in writing and shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk.

12. Upon confirmation of such special assessment roll in the manner above set forth, the Council shall be authorized to make a complete and full report to the Council, within the time specified by the Council, as to the construction, rebuilding or repair of any sidewalk or part of a sidewalk, and the expense and cost of such construction, rebuilding or repairing, and the proportion of such expense and cost to be charged to each lot or premises.

13. The City may collect the amount of any sidewalk assessment together with all interest, charges and fees due thereon, plus the cost of such collection, from the owner or owners of the lot or premises assessed.

14. All crosswalks shall be constructed and kept in repair by the

City under the direction of the City Manager.

15. Failure to mail any notice required to be sent by this ordinance shall not invalidate any assessment made hereunder or any assessment roll.

16. If any provision, section, clause or phrase of the application thereof to any person or circumstance within the City shall be invalid by any court, such invalidity shall not affect any remaining portion or portions of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application, provided such remaining portions or applications are not determined by the Court to be inoperative and to be declared to be severable.

17. This ordinance shall become effective December 14, 1951.

If the owner, owners or agent of any lot or premises shall refuse or neglect to build, rebuild or repair any sidewalk, in the manner and within the time prescribed by the Council, the Council may by resolution appoint an agent or employee appointed by the Council to be authorized to construct, rebuild or repair any sidewalk or part of a sidewalk, and the expense and cost of so doing shall be assessed to the person or persons who refuse or neglect to build, rebuild or repair the sidewalk, and the same shall be charged and assessed against such lot and/or premises.
