

# Churchill Foiled In Late Charge

Wayne Memorial erupted for four runs in the sixth inning to score a non-league baseball victory over Livonia Churchill, 5-3.

Churchill's Gordy Miller pitched a strong game for the first five innings, giving up one run on four hits, but the Wayne bats starting booming in the sixth.

The Chargers scored all their runs in the third on four

hits and a walk. Miller singled after one out and Bob Blais followed with a walk. Brian Kelly struck out but Roy Henriksson continued his "hot bat" with a single to lead the bases.

MICK CROM singled to score Miller and Blais and Rick Dreher followed with another single to score Henriksson and it was 3-0 Churchill.

Wayne got one back in the bottom of the inning with Scott Fager being hit by a pitch, moving to second on a sacrifice and dashing home on a single by Jim MacGregor.

The Chargers went down, one, two, three in the fourth and fifth but came alive in the sixth. Dreher walked and Bruce VanWagoner singled

but a ground out ruined a scoring opportunity.

MacGregor opened the bottom of the sixth with an error. Hanson and Herbert followed with back to back singles and Charger Coach Roger Frayer replaced Miller with Mike Keller on the mound.

Steve Mauch greeted Keller, with a single and was followed by a walk and another single and Wayne was on top, 5-3.

ERNIE COMINI opened the Churchill seventh with a pitch hit single but was cut down on a force out with Blais safe at first. Brian Kelly singled and

Blais moved to second. Henriksson and Crom both drove deep to the outfield but the rally was halted and the Chargers throttled.

Churchill hosts Western Six rival Northville Wednesday (May 3), and travels to Farmington Harrison on Monday.

GUYN BURKE and Ken Yuhaz were double individual winners for Franklin with Burke taking firsts in the long and high jump and

Yuhaz in the 100 and 220 yard dashes.

The Patriots shutout Glenn in the shot put and 220 yard dash. Marshall Wickman, Dan Wells and Jim Ninnis took the first three places in the shot and Harvey Allen and John Casen followed Yuhaz in the 220.

Glenn boasted winners in Jim Lockwood in the mile and Bob Faust in the two mile but the rest was all Franklin with

the Patriots sweeping the three relays.

## Franklin Girls Winning; Crush Thurston, 89-11

Does It Again

The Franklin girls won all 12 events to crush Thurston in a Northwest Suburban track meet, 89-11.

The best Thurston could muster was three seconds and eight thirds.

Franklin's Gail Kopchka established a league record in the 80 yard hurdles with a clocking of :11.4, breaking the former mark of :12.0 set in 1971.

Miss Kopchka also won the standing long jump with a leap of 5'11".

Maureen Donehue was another double winner in the Patriot assault with firsts in the 50 yard dash and 440 run.

The Franklin girls collected seven firsts in a 12 event meet with Oak Park for their second dual win, 55-45.

Franklin's Patty Varani stole the show with a Northwest Suburban league record in the high jump with a leap of 5'0". Miss Varani broke the mark held by teammate Gail Kopchka at 4'11".

Miss Kopchka put on a show of her own with firsts in the standing long jump, 80 yard hurdles and 100 yard dash. She was also a member of the winning 440 relay squad, clocked in :56.9.

Franklin's Maureen Donehue won the 440 in 1:05.5. The 880 relay saw Franklin

break the wire first with Jan Kaufman, Susie Mukiten, Mary Lannore, and Miss Varani making up the squad.

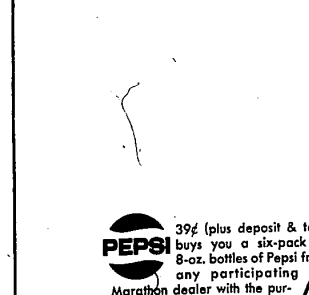
