To Ottawa

Three Observerland 12-
year-old students have been
named to attend a safety
patrol rally in Ottawa, On-
tario, May 17-20, as guests of
Automobile Club of Michigan.

They are among 50 state
safety patrols chosen to take
the all-expenses paid,
four-day trip to Ottawa, where
the 12th annual Canadian
National Safety Patrol Rally is being held.

Selected as most out-
standing in the area this year

School; Wilford Ebrigt, of 265
S. Carlson, Westland; Cady
School; and Ronald Blotnik, of

The Michigan delegation

year.

Michigan for this year's trip
were selected from among
more than 60,000 boys and
girls, protecting fellow
classmates at 2,800 schools in
the state.

'Moratorium'
Asked At OCC

A moratorium on all but
essential activities of Oakland
Community College was
proposed today by Hope Frey,
a candidate in the June 12
election for the OCC Board of
Trustees.

The four - campus college
has approximately 16,000
students and operates exten-
sion classes in a number of
locations throughout Oakland

"I would like to see
everything but teaching and
essential supporting services
for teaching stopped until the
college's total programs can
be reviewed," Mrs. Frey said.
"The college is heavily in debt
and yet there are costly
programs operating that seem
to be causing internal friction
without contributing much to
the education of students."
