## 3 Named By AAUW In Fellowship Grants

Three members outstanding in educational contributions recently were honored by the Farmington branch of the American Association of University Women through named gifts to the AAUW fellowship fund.

Mrs. Robert Briggs, Mrs. Henry Gram and Mrs. Robert Newhauser were chosen for the honor this year as the branch made its annual contribution to the fund that helps American and foreign women on the higher educational level.

The chapter each year makes grants - from funds earned through its annual book sale - in the name of outstanding members. With this year's contribution, the Farmington branch has raised its total gift to \$2,033, placing it tenth among the AAUW chapters of the nation in the matter of per capita giving to the fellowship fund.

OF THE THREE members cited with named grants, two have earned doctorate degrees and the other a master's.
