# Nine File For 2 Seats On Clarenceville Board

CLARENCEVILLE Nine persons, including one incumbent, have filed for two seats on the Clarenceville Board of Education. The election is June 12.

Among the candidates are three college students, a former board member, three housewives and a businessman. Five come from the same subdivision, Hearstone, in the Livonia portion of the tri-school district that also includes a portion of Farmington and Redford Township.

The two seats are presently held by Ray Chaiken, 12-year veteran who has announced he will be a candidate for re-election, and Dr. Martin T. Wechsler, who will leave the board after 12 years service.

Dr. Wechsler, currently the board president, is taking a year's sabbatical as chairman of Wayne University's math department to do research in England.

Chaiken, 49, lives with his wife, Frances, and their children at 20223 Weyher, in the Livonia sector. He is plant manager of equipment engineering with the Ford Motor Co. Steel Division.

THE OTHER candidates are:

LAWRENCE KOPELMAN, 18, of 20919 Maplewood, Livonia, a Clarenceville High School graduate now attending the University of Detroit.

Enrolled in pre-med studies, Taaffe completed his freshman year with a 4.0 grade average and recently received a merit award from the American Rubber Co. as an outstanding first-year student.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Taaffe.

GARY R. SERLIN, 21, of 19635 St. Francis, is a Schoolcraft College student preparing for a law degree. Active in local politics since 1966, he ran for precinct delegate in Tuesday's presidential primary. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Morton Serlin and also graduated from Clarenceville High School.

MRS. GERTRUDE WALSH, 42, of 19674 Floral, mother of a son, and active in PTA circles for many years. A candidate in last year's school board election, she is the retiring president of Botsford Elementary School PTA and was appointed by the board of education to the citizens advisory group studying school boundaries. She also chaired an anti-busing rally that drew hundreds of area residents to hear NAG leader Irene McCabe.

ROY WHITENER, 35, of 20052 Poinciana, Redford Township, father of six. Owner of R.E. Whitener Asphalt Paving, he will make his first bid for public office.

WHILE WHITENER was listed as a candidate, Clarenceville school officials were checking with their attorney on the validity of his petition since figures were used to signify the date the petition was signed.

Instructions call for the date to be written out, Clarenceville officials pointed out, and it is this point that must be clarified, they said. They had expected a ruling from their attorney by the 4:30 p.m. Monday filing deadline, but it did come.





## Top Band Ratings Taken By C'Ville

CLARENCEVILLE'S Junior High Stage Band competed recently in the first stage band festival held for junior and senior high groups in southeastern Michigan. The band came away with straight Division I ratings at the meet held at Henry Ford Community College, Dearborn.

Clarenceville's band was one of two junior high bands to compete, the others all being senior high groups.

The band played under the direction of Ted Mallins. Judges selected "all-star" bandmen from listening to solo passages during competitive sessions, and Clarenceville came up with nine all-star musicians.

They were Mark Niles, guitar; Tim Jeffries, alto saxophone; Victor Favot, tenor saxophone; Roger Zacks, trumpet; Mark and Ken DesJarlais, trumpet; Mark Wozniak, trombone; Ingrid Stalmanis, flute; and Brad Rowens, trombone.

THE STAGE BAND will play May 17 for the Livonia Jewish Congregation.

The stage band will present a joint concert with the senior high stage band from Northville on Wednesday, May 24, in the L.E. Schmidt Auditorium. Sharing the baton with Ted Mallins will be Bob Williams, director of the Northville band.

The concert will begin at 7:30 p.m.

A Greek festival and bazaar will run from May 19 to 21 in the Livonia Mall to mark the naming of the proposed Greek Orthodox Church to be built in Livonia.

The church is to be named St. Constantine and Helen. The festival is to be held in the Mall's Coney Island - Crowley Court. George Keros, owner of the Coney Island in the mall, planned the festivities and will donate the proceeds from the Sunday bazaar and his restaurant to the church building fund.

Authentic Greek entertainment featuring dancers, a band and vocalists will begin at 7 p.m. on Friday and Saturday and run from 2 to 4 p.m. on Sunday.

The bazaar is scheduled from 12 noon to 6 p.m. Sunday and will feature homemade Greek pastries, Souvlakia (Shishkabob), handmade Greek items, statues, souvenirs and mementos.
