## IRS Indicts Local Man

**FARMINGTON**  
Harry Harwood of Farmington, has been indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in Detroit, on two counts of knowingly and willfully making and subscribing to false statements of financial condition which he submitted to the Internal Revenue Service.

On these financial statements, one of which was submitted in an attempt to compromise an existing tax liability in excess of \$25,000, Harwoods claimed that he did not have any interests in any real estate.

However, the investigation disclosed that on December 15, 1967, and October 10, 1968, (the dates of the financial statements, Harwoods had hidden interests in various parcels of real estate amounting to \$18,246 and \$39,587, respectively.

The maximum penalty for each count is three years in prison and or a \$5,000 fine. The intelligence division of the Internal Revenue Service conducted the investigation.
