Dr. Russell J. Kleis, professor of administration and higher education at Michigan State University, will deliver the address during commencement exercises at Clarenceville High School on Thursday, June 15.

Rev. John E. Smith, pastor of St. Priscilla Catholic Church, Livonia, will be baccalaureate speaker on Sunday, June 11.

Both programs will be held in the L.E. Schmidt Auditorium beginning at 8 p.m.

**FATHER SMITH**, who has been pastor at St. Priscilla since 1968, will speak on "Cross Over the Bridge." "Learning a Living" is the title of Dr. Kleis' address.

The Rev. Elsie Johns, pastor of Clarenceville's United Methodist Church, will offer the invocation and benediction at commencement.

In addition to his title listed above, Prof. Kleis is director of graduate studies in continuing education and director of Project ENABEL at MSU. ENABEL is a demonstration program designed to encourage cooperative efforts to improve enabling services to educationally handicapped and out-of-school youth and adults.

Kleis took his BS and MS degrees from MSU and completed PhD work at the University of Chicago. A native of Dearborn, Father Smith attended public schools and also attended public schools in Saline. He earned a BA degree from Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit and continued with theological studies at Mount St. Mary's of the West in Norwood, O. He was ordained May 21, 1949.

Father Smith has served as associate pastor at Guardian Angel Church, Clawson; Our Lady of Lourdes, River Rouge; St. Theresa, Detroit; St. Thomas the Apostle, Detroit; St. Mary Queen of All Creation, New Baltimore; and St. Cyprian, Riverview.

Presently, he is clergy representative for Northwest Wayne Vicariate and vicariate theologian for Church World and Kingdom.
