

Festival Proceeds Will Help Build Radio Station

A demonstration of karate and a Charlie Chaplin movie are planned for the WRTA festival Saturday, June 17, in the Zions Cultural Center, 10 Mile Road, one block west of Southfield Road, Southfield. The festival is a benefit for the recently-formed WRTA Enterprises, a non-profit group being organized by about 20 Southfield and Detroit area college students. The group meets regularly at the home of Jean Pohjola, 19414 Hilton, Southfield. Miss Pohjola is a student at Farmington's Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College.

FUNDS from the festival will be used to help the group start its own radio station, operating with the call letters WRTA. The group's objective, according to Miss Pohjola, is to "upgrade the aesthetic value of the media," as well as to give interested persons an opportunity to work on creative projects. "Too many young people are stagnating now," commented Miss Pohjola. With the help of electronics experts, the young people are hoping to build their own station and have it on the air by July. Programming will include feature shows, interviews, discussions, art and music reviews. "We're aiming towards people who like to think, be creative and appreciate aesthetic things," said Miss Pohjola. The group also hopes to publish a magazine and a newspaper.

THE FESTIVAL will begin at 2 p.m. with an outside flea market and bake sale. The doors to the festival will open at 6 p.m. with the karate demonstrations. Admission is \$1.50. Movies and art shows will be presented throughout the evening. Rock and roll, jazz and folk groups from Southfield will make special appearances throughout the evening. Frank Allison, folk-rock guitarist, and the jazz group Arcadio will be among the featured attractions. One-act plays will be presented by local actors and actresses. The festival will continue until 12:30 a.m. Tickets will be available at the door.
