10 Mile Is Closed

Ten Mile Road in Farmington Township will be closed temporarily due to construction by the State Highway Department.

Ten Mile will be closed at the east side of Haggerty Rd. and at the Bell Telephone Co. building, about 1,400 feet east of Haggerty Rd.

In addition, there will be a partial closure of Ten Mile at Grand River to permit construction of a bridge to carry 10 Mile traffic over the future I-96 freeway.

The state estimates the road will be opened to through traffic in about three months, or near Sept. 15. A detour is provided by way of Grand River and Haggerty Rds.

Teeples Avoids Leadership; What About That Judge Roth?

It can hardly be said that Farmington Township Supervisor Earl Teeples exerted a leadership role in the citywide campaign conducted successfully May 16.

Teeples remained silent publicly, declining to take a stand on incorporation and opting to let the people make up their own minds.

It makes little difference what Teeples' position of incorporation was, but he should have taken a stand before the election if the title "supervisor" is supposed to be important.

Residents have the right to know the views from the elected leader of their community on such an important, non-partisan question as cityhood.

This writer criticized former Supervisor Curtis Hall for failing to take a public stand on consolidation and funds Earl Teeples equally guilty.

Now that he's elected to the charter commission, it is expected his silence will end, and the supervisor will tribute many views on what charter provisions will best suit the new city.

The "why" is fairly understandable but the "how" can be debated if one is willing to accept integrated schools but would choose another alternative than busing.

Despite Roth's optimism, my position remains that it is very improbable that cross-district busing will be implemented this fall.

Although more pessimistic than Roth, I am against amending the U.S. Constitution to ban busing and feel the congressional moratorium on busing is clearly unconstitutional and will be declared so shortly after President Nixon signs the legislative injunctions against the courts.

My pessimism stems from the practical difficulties of purchasing the buses and to resign teachers and principals to come up with a 10 percent black ratio. Obviously, the case will go to the Circuit Court of Appeals and it is my guess that courts will find loopholes in Roth's ruling to open a delay in implementation pending decision on appeal.
