Westland Adray A 'Baseball Whopper'

Westland Burger King remained undefeated in Adray action with triumphs over North Farmington's Koebel Diamond and Birmingham Varsity Shop.

Burger King stands with three wins and Coach Ernie Lyons squad takes on Northville Reef today (Wednesday) at the Northville Athletic Field at 6 p.m. It was all Art Mach in the

Koebel victory with the Wayne right-hander tossing a one-hitter and chalking up 16 strikeouts. Dave Conlin hurled for Westland against Birmingham and tossed a five-hitter in his first start, to win 16-3.

Burger King zipped past Koebel Diamond, 5-0, behind the work of Mach. John Combs suffered the loss, allowing five hits, striking out five and walking six.

Dennis Dean drew a base on balls to fill the sacks and Conlin singled to put Burger King on the board.

Burger King concluded its scoring in the fourth with four runs on only two hits. Phil McMillan tripled, Chuck Stammer walked and Mack was safe on a fielder's choice to fill the bases.

Derderian walked to force in McMillan and Fields singled to score Stammer and Mack. Derderian and Fields worked a double steal with Derderian safe at home with the fifth and final run.

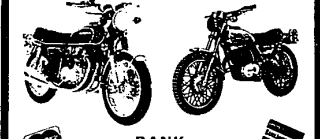
Northville Downs Opening Tonight
