Staman Acres Residents To Get Sewer Hearing

About 60 residents of Staman Acres subdivision were present at the Farmington Township Board meeting Monday night to hear proposed figures on a sewer project which has come under fire by some as being too costly.

The controversy over the petitions centered on the three-year period signatures had been collected, because some who signed had already left the area. Residents have requested a public hearing on the matter, and a date will be set at next Monday's board meeting.

The cost of the project is said to be higher than similar projects in surrounding areas. Cost for the new sewers is \$800 per unit to be paid by the lot owner over a 15-year period. The system will cross the road nine times. Since the road is new, extra care is being taken to insure that it does not age fast due to heavy equipment traffic.

Also due to the late model paving job, excavation for the sewer system must be done in a tunneling fashion rather than stripping the land from the top which Cairns said would be a cheaper method. Another factor for the added cost, according to Cairns, is the large land frontage of most of the homes which accounts for a larger total area that must be dug up to complete the job.

There is doubt among many homeowners on whether sewers are needed or if the present septic systems should be continued.

PERC TESTS on undeveloped land in the subdivision have shown the land is incapable of supporting septic tanks. A walk-through inspection by Oakland County health officials indicated a number of septic in use are failing and discharging waste into the ditches.

During the past few weeks, county health officials have been conducting a house-by-house inspection to test existing septic in the subdivision to determine whether a serious health hazard exists. Residents in the area complained of out of date petitions being used as evidence of a desire for a new system. But the board concluded that a signature is a signature when it comes to petitions, and they are usable if validated.

The board had originally requested residents in the district to submit their suggestions to the superintendent's office by May 15.
