LWV Backs Integration

Peaceful and thoughtful compliance with the U.S. District Court desegregation order is being urged by the West Bloomfield-Farmington Area League of Women Voters.

MRS. RUBYJEAN GOULD, president of the local LWV, comments:

"We ask the citizens of metropolitan Detroit to remain calm and devote their best energies to making the desegregation process peaceful and constructive for the education of all the children in our area.

"Respect for the law is of great importance to us as citizens and to the education of our children. Legal rulings have been consistent for many years in holding that separate is not equal."

THE LEAGUE, in a statement released this week, emphasizes that:

"The transportation of children to and from school has long been part of public educational systems.

"In researching various methods of desegregating schools across the country, the League of Women Voters of Metropolitan Detroit has not found any method of significant desegregation that does not involve transportation in some degree."

The metropolitan LWV has established a Metropolitan Integration Committee which has been working the past seven months to provide the public with factual information, and has been conducting forums on desegregation.

District Lacks Fleet For Busing Plan

FARMINGTON Farmington School District presently owns 50 buses which transport about 7,500 students at a cost of about \$48 per pupil.

That cost compares closely with the estimate of U.S. District Judge Stephen Roth that the cost of transporting students under the proposed 53-school district cluster plan would be \$40-50 per pupil.

IN ORDERING that a cross-district plan be implemented by the state superintendent of instruction, Roth estimated there are presently 225,000 students being bused in the 53 suburban districts included in the area to be involved in busing.

William Frisk, business manager for Farmington School District, says he agrees with Roth's estimates on the number of pupils being bused in the suburbs and on the per-pupil transportation cost.

Frisk estimates, however, that there is little chance any of Farmington's 50 buses can be "cut loose" from present schedules to transport students to and from the Redford High attendance area.

Under Roth's suggested cluster arrangement, Farmington and Clarenceville would be paired with Redford High and Cadillac Junior High attendance areas in Detroit.

Roth admits it will take more buses than now owned by the 53 districts to implement the busing program he wants implemented by Dr. John Porter, state superintendent. He estimates it will require the purchase of some 300 additional school buses.

PRESENTLY, Detroit public schools do not own any school buses because its students are transported by the public DSR system with parents paying the fare.

"We just cannot turn out buses loose for that kind of trip," comments Frisk.
