Horses Live In Observerland

Sixty years ago horses were a common sight in Observerland.

While they've mostly been replaced by cars, there are still times when you'll see some youngster galloping along Schoolcraft Road or Grand River Avenue astride a noble steed.

There are several horseback riding and boarding stables within a short drive of Observerland -- and there are some located right in the heart of the northwest Detroit suburbs.

One of the private stables is Apache Mike's on Farmington Road in Livonia.

Its owner, Mike Algero boards some 30 horses for area families and keeps a couple dozen on hand himself for rent to occasional public customers who drop in.

"Any type of clean fun is good for the kids," Algero says.

While members of the stables get priority, Apache Mike often rents horses by the hour to the public.

It's not unusual to see a pony-tailed girl guiding her horse down one of the paths along Farmington Road from Apache Mike's.

And it's "clean fun" for a summer day.
