All children in Oakland County from three months of age through high school are being offered free immunizations and tuberculin skin tests by the Oakland County Health Department. Immunizations will be given at the First Methodist Church located at Warner and Grand River from 9 a.m. to 12 noon Thursday, July 13.

Tests will also be given at the South Oakland Health Department, 2725 Greenfield Rd., Southfield, from 8:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. No appointment is necessary but previous immunization records should be brought in.
