Westland, Dearborn Move Ahead Of Idle Redford

Westland Burger King and Dearborn spurred ahead of powerful Redford in the Adray baseball standings with identical 1-0 victories.

Burger King came up with a run in the bottom of the seventh to tie Garden City, 1-0, and Dearborn pushed across a run in the top of the eighth to edge Plymouth Bidwell by the same score.

Redford was idle while Birmingham Varsity Shop and North Farmington Koebel had to postpone their contest when the umpires failed to show.

Westland and Dearborn sport identical 6-1 records for a 12 point production with two points per win. Redford stands with five wins and one tie for

11 points with a tie counting one point.

Redford and Westland square off Sunday July 2 at Thurston High at 1:30 p.m., with feathers sure to fly.

ART MACH chalked up his third victory with a three hit performance against Garden City in the Burger King 1-0 triumph. The ace righthander struck out eight and walked two and has been the backbone of Coach George Yake's team.

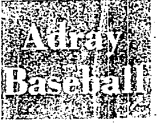
Mach has recorded two shut-outs, allowed three runs in four games, struck out 40 in 28 innings and has walked only six.

Bowlers from Observeland and all other sections of the nation will have a new goal to aim at when next season gets into full swing.

It will be known as the Presidential Sports Award and the announcement from the White House gives further proof of the impact the ancient game of tupples has on the American scene.

Announcement of the new award was made by the President's Council on Physical Fitness and competition for it will be open to all bowlers, starting with the 18-year-olds.

THE REGULATIONS and standards announced by the Council call for a regular and "ready, but not rigorous" schedule of bowling. It asks that 150 games be bowled over a period of four months and no more than five games a day can be credited toward the total. Further, the 150 games must be bowled in not less than 34 different days.
