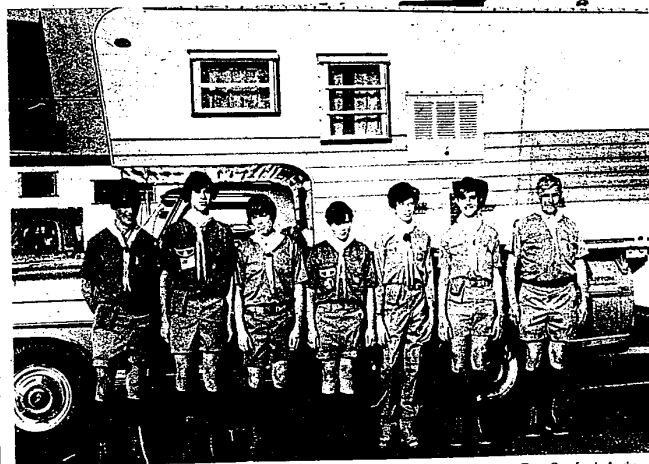


Theater Trip Is Planned

Fireworks Site Moved For Founders Festival

Fireworks at the Farmington Founders Festival

will blaze closer to the heart of downtown Farmington this year than they have in the past.

The display, which normally lights the night over the intersection of Farmington Rd. and 12 Mile Rd., this year will shatter the night quiet near 10 Mile Rd. and Powers Rd.

The Farmington City Council gave 2-1 qualified permission for the new site at the meeting Wednesday, adding that City Manager Robert Deadman could cancel the approval if he could not get the cooperation of the township police department.

TRAFFIC EXPECTED to jam the area for the display was the chief concern of the three members of the council present who heard the request from the Farmington Founders Day committee.

Robert Beauchamp, fireworks chairman, asked for permission for the site on the ground it would be more accessible to more people than the old site.

Deadman was unenthusiastic when asked for an opinion by the council. "Traffic would just stop" in the area, he said, based on past festival displays.

"You are going to have problems wherever you hold it," Beauchamp argued. He also said it would be easier to get to the display on foot at the new site.

Council members John Allen and Ralph Yoder voted for the new site; Councilman Fred M. Seibert opposed it.

IN OTHER BUSINESS:
The council tabled action on the controversial cluster housing zoning for a 22-acre

parcel on the west side of Drake Rd. north of Freedom Drive. A legal opinion read at the meeting indicated four votes were needed for the adoption of the ordinance and only three council members were present.

Bonds for a \$16,000 parking lot at Grand River and Farmington went to the National Bank of Detroit, low bidder at five per cent interest.
