It was Volas against Mike Dreyer in the opening game with Volas holding the upper hand, and chalking up the win. Garden City jumped to a one-run lead in the first when Terry Dobbs singled, stole second and scored on Rich McColm's single.

GARDEN CITY made it 3-0 in the third when Paul Pierson singled, stole second and scored on Steve Orr's hit. Dobbs followed with a run-producing double.

A two-bagger by Steve Orr and a single by Ken Gugel pushed the margin to four in the fifth stanza. Walks to Pierson and Steve Orr started the triple and Burger King was up, 3-0.

Bob Atkins' crew now boasts an overall mark of 8-1 with 0 Churchill's National Pride the closest contender at 6-1. Fancher's and Phillippi slipped to identical 5-3 records.

Tom Miller hurled a four-hitter in the North Farmington contests, walking one and striking out eight with Lou Doot suffering the defeat.

Redford opened with four runs in the first.

R.J. LEROUX walked, stole second and scored on an error with Steve Friedman safe at second. Friedman moved around to third on a wild pitch and scored on a sacrifice fly by Kurt Fritz. Mark Yourchick, Glenn Richmond and Lupe Bravo followed with hits to push across two more runs.

The bottom of the inning saw North Farmington produce its two runs. Chuck Wolfe tripled in a North runner who had got on via an error and Tom Hamilton singled in Wolfe, and it stood 4-2.

Warholak added four in the fourth to all but tuck the game away. Bravo walked, stole second and moved to third on a hit by Kall. Miller singled in Bravo and LeRoux was safe on a fielder's choice with Miller out at second. Mike Johnston singled to score Kall and Miller scored on a throwing error.

FRIEDMAN followed with

another hit and Johnston put on the speed and made it 8-2 for Redford.

LeRoux finished the scoring in the sixth when he was on an error, moved to second on an infield out, stole third and scampered in on a sacrifice by Friedman.

Left-hander Tom Nippa went after Stevenson's varsity squad (Fancher's) and captured his fifth win with no defeats, 5-0.

THE REDFORD HURLER chalked up a three-hitter struck out 11 and walked six. Terry Laird, Tom Centers and Zaliagris worked for Fancher's with starter Laird suffering the loss.

A five-run explosion in the first gave Warholak all the margin it needed for victory. LeRoux drew a walk and stole second. Friedman singled to score LeRoux. Johnston delivered a single to score Friedman, moved to second

on an error and scored on a passed ball.

Richmond singled, Bravo walked and Kall grounded out to complete the opening stanza.

FANCHER'S came back with three tallies in the second without the benefit of a hit—just Redford mistakes.

Mark Tressler drew a walk and Terry Laird grounded into what appeared to be the "first of two" double plays. Nippa picked up the grounder but threw into center field. Mark Kiefer followed with a grounder to shortstop that was again tossed into right field with one scoring.

Terry McElroy then sacrificed in Laird and Tom Centers grounded out for the third run.

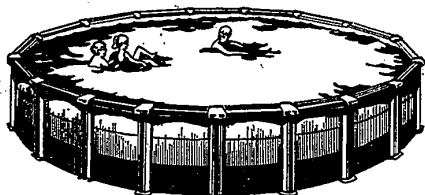
