"Pick up litter. Follow the code that a Girl Scout always leaves a place cleaner than she found it."

"Rats? If you have rat trouble, clean up trash which provides feeding and living areas for them."

"Develop a backyard compost heap to change some of your family garbage into fertilizer."

These are among numerous "activity hints" offered to Girl Scouts of Metropolitan Detroit by a group of "eco - consultants" from the University of Michigan.

Under a grant from the scouts, the U-M group has been working with the youngsters since January to help them live more harmoniously with the environment and initiate ecological changes in their communities.

"Urbanization has brought about many environmental problems, such as traffic congestion, urban blight and air and water pollution," comments William B. Stapp, a U-M natural resources professor who heads the Scout's "Eco-Action" Program.

"It's up to citizens - particularly young citizens like the Girl Scouts - to develop new attitudes about the environment and to take a leadership role in stimulating change."

Prof. Stapp, who has had extensive experience in environmental programs for youngsters, is assisted in his efforts by two U-M students, Miss Elizabeth Grant, a master's degree candidate in environmental education, and Miss Pamela Breitmeyer, a U-M undergraduate majoring in architecture and natural resources.

One afternoon each week Miss Breitmeyer and Miss Grant - known to the Scouts as Cricket and Liz - are on call in the Girl Scouts' downtown Detroit office to respond to telephone inquiries about the environment. The phone arrangement has been dubbed "Eco - Line."

The U-M students also contribute articles to a monthly bulletin called "Knapsack" and produce various "idea packets" and manuals detailing suggested ecological activities. One feature of the monthly bulletin is an environmental question and answer column based on a "Dear Abby" format.

IN ADDITION, The U-M group was responsible for establishing an ecology library containing audio - visual aids, publications, environmental testing kits
