Summer Courses Start At Community Center

FARMINGTON New classes at the Farmington Community Center include tennis and bicycle repair.

The center sponsors a series of classes through the summer months, beginning in mid-July. To register, contact the center, 24705 Farmington Rd., and pay the registration fee.

This year's courses include:

- Creative art construction, with Karyl Hill, is for children from five to seven years of age. Tuesdays and Thursdays. The fee is \$16 for six lessons.
- Artists crafts, a course concentrating on sculpture in clay, wood or metal, macrame, etc. for ages eight to 11, will be held Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Fee is \$24, materials included.
- Sculpture, for adults and teens, will meet Tuesday and Thursday for three weeks. The fee is \$16.
- Bicycle maintenance and repair starts July 18, taught by John Harris, who once biked his way across the U.S. The class meets Tuesday and Wednesday nights, is for anyone eight years or older. The fee is \$10.
- A charm school for young teens, featuring a fashion show at the end of the course, will be held Mondays and Wednesdays. The fee is \$10 for six sessions.

• Story time, for two groups, starting at age one, with a second session for ages three to five, will combine playacting, song and stories for preschool children.

• Tap dancing classes for beginners and more advanced students will be held Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Fee is \$24.

• Tennis courses start July 17, will meet Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings for three weeks. Bruce Davidson, tennis clinic instructor at North Farmington High, is added to the staff. Fee is \$18.
