Storm Wreaks Havoc In Farmington Area

FARMINGTON
A brittle old dead elm tree stands on Grand
River west of Farmington Rd., with scarcely a twig
shaken loose. Two blocks away a limber green tree
tipe inches in diameter is snapped off at the base.
The aftermath of a freak, brutal thunderstorm
that tore through the Farmington area was spotty,
widespread and generally a mess.
Mr. and Mrs. Joseph P. Hommel, 25006 Castlereigh, had a giant maple tree come crashing through
the roof.

Power cut off transmission at the Farmington
Township Police station during the height of the
storm, while rain not draining fast enough off the roof
city police called out all men for several hours to
direct traffic and keep children away from chain-link
fences electrified by falling wires.
Traffic lights at most major intersections went
dark, and traffic was controlled by hand.
But there were no serious injuries.

the poor visibility in driving rain injured two branches to clean up, shingles loose and assorted damage caused by falling limbs.




