WAR BETWEEN MEN AND WOMEN -- Loosely based on James Thurber's work, this is the story of a man who is going blind, who hates children and dogs and who marries a widow with children and dog. (PG, A-3)

FRENZY -- Alfred Hitchcock is back again in excellent form with a chiller set in England. Alec McCowen plays the Scotland Yard inspector. (R, A-4)

THE LAST OF THE RED HOT LOVERS -- Alan Arkin tries to romance Sally Kellerman, Paula Prentiss and Rene Taylor as his own marriage grows stale. A Neil Simon comedy. (PG, A-3)

THE GODFATHER -- Marlon Brando plays a bungler the Corleone family in a film which explores the public and private lives of members of the Mafia. (R, A-3)

PLAY IT AGAIN SAM -- Woody Allen plays a bungler whose friends try to fix him up with a series of blind dates when his wife walks out on him. (PG, A-3)

FIDDLER ON THE ROOF -- The movie, based on Broadway's longest-running musical, lives up to expectations with excellent photography and singing. (G, A-1)

THE FRENCH CONNECTION -- The fight against heroin smuggling on a large scale makes an exciting, realistic detective movie. With Gene Hackman. (R, A-4)

DUCK, YOU SUCKER -- The scene is the Mexican Revolution around 1900 and Red Steiger plays a bandito and James Coburn, an Irish motorcycleist. (PG, none)

JUNIOR BONNER -- Steve McQueen plays a rodeo bronc-buster who helps straighten out the rest of the family, including his father (Robert Preston) who wants to go to Australia. (PG, A-2)

NAPOLEON AND SAMANTHA -- Michael Douglas plays the young man who helps Johnny Whitaker and Jodie Foster protect their pet lion, while evading a madman. A Walt Disney film. (G, A-1)

SLAUGHTERHOUSE FIVE -- Billy Pilgrim, American optimist, takes some time trips from World War II, to establishment life to a friendly planet along with a lush Hollywood starlet. (R, A-4)

PRIME CUT -- A murder victim is fed into a slaughterhouse sausage grinder, and Lee Marvin plays a Chicago mobster who learns a lot about the meat-packing industry. Gene Hackman also stars. (R, C)

MARY, QUEEN OF SCOTS -- Vanessa Redgrave plays Queen Mary and Glenda Jackson portrays her cousin Elizabeth in this historical spectacular. (G, A-2)

WHAT'S UP DOC? -- Ryan O'Neal and Barbra Streisand star in this comedy about four mixed-up valises and an absent-minded anthropologist. (G, A-1)

JOE KIDD -- Clint Eastwood plays a shiftless gunslinger who becomes involved in a fight by a group of Mexican-Americans to save their land from being taken over by a big company. (PG, A-3)

Plymouth Rider Takes Award

Riding a horse she trained herself and wearing a costume that "was a family project," Lori Pashby of Plymouth took first place honors in the Arabian native costume championship of the Michigan All-Arabian Horse Show at the State Fair grounds.

The annual All-Arabian show is the "Academy Awards" show for Michigan horsemen, topped only by the Nationals. More than 700 horses from all over the U.S., including Hawaii, competed in the four-day show.

MISS PASHBY, who is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Pashby of Beck Road, will be a senior at Plymouth High School. She went on to show her gelding and win two more ribbons, a first place in saddle seat equitation and a second place in English pleasure.

Her wins entitle her to go on to the national competitions to be held in October, probably in Oklahoma, and she is hoping to be able to attend.

Miss Pashby won out after competing against 15 other qualifiers, all in gorgeous costumes.

She received the H. Claude Fillion Memorial Trophy. At Plymouth High, she is a member of the track team.
