

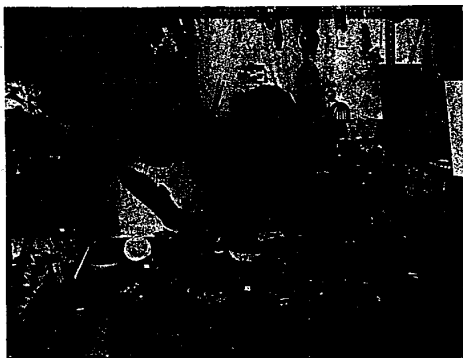
Counselor To Speak To PWP

New Shop Has Wares Of 78 Local Craftsmen

Nearly 80 artists and craftsmen from this area have wares displayed in a new Plymouth store devoted solely to local work.

The Little Original Shoppe, 1259 Ann Arbor Road between Main and Sheldon, is filled with a wide variety of handcrafted items, all the work of artisans from southeast Michigan.

Shawls, plaques, belts, dried florals, purses, beads, dolls, ties and many more "originals" are on display in the store operated by two Plymouth sisters, Mrs. Daisy Proctor and Mrs. Karlene Oumait, and their mother, Mrs. Goldie Hornbach, also of Plymouth.

"SO MANY PEOPLE are talented and have no outlet for the things they make," Mrs.

Proctor said. "You can use only so many as gifts, and you run out of customers in your immediate circle. We're trying to provide an outlet for all this beautiful craft work."

The three, all knowledgeable in several kinds of craft work, took over the store after it had been operated for about a month by another proprietor.

THEY EXPANDED the original list of contributors to include, at last count, 78 non-professional artists from Farmington, Livonia, Plymouth, Northville, Bloomfield Hills, Ann Arbor, Ypsilanti, Dearborn, Chelsea and many other locations.

In age, artists, range from Mrs. Proctor's 11-year-old daughter, Kathy, to a number of senior citizens.

With such a large number now showing wares, the proprietors now are looking especially for people with craftwork different than any they carry.

"But we'd like to talk to anyone with art work to market," Mrs. Proctor said.

THE STORE opens at 10 a.m. Monday through Saturday and closes at 9 p.m. Friday and at 5 p.m. the other days.

In addition, it sponsors flea markets on the grounds adjacent each Saturday, renting table space to all interested.

Mrs. Proctor said the shop soon will be offering a special service supplying complete original decor for any type of party, from invitations to centerpiece.

Classes also are planned in the fall. They will be scheduled day and evening in a variety of crafts as interest warrants, she added.

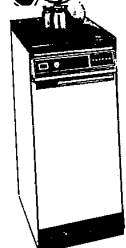
Class size is limited to 20. The nursery has recently added a special projects room to its facilities.

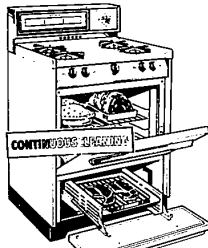

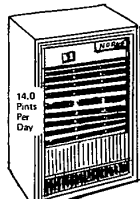

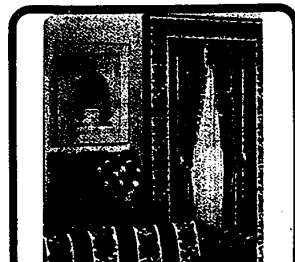
Smiths Celebrate 50th Anniversary
