The counselors were participating in "Classrooms in Industry," a summer program conducted by Wayne State University and co-sponsored by the Office for Economic Education. Mrs. Parrott said, "I was impressed throughout with the importance placed on the individual. Even training programs seem designed to teach people how to get along with others -- and the foremen we talked to think that's good."
