Joan Wenson Wins Ballet Scholarship

Joan Wenson of Chapelweigh Drive, Farmington, was one of three ballerinas awarded \$100 national scholarships at the Cecchetti Ballet Conference held last month at Michigan State University.

The scholarships were awarded by the Cecchetti Council of America to provide talented youngsters the opportunity for additional ballet training with their own teachers.

The other two award winners are from Illinois.

The winners were chosen by Margaret March, adjudicator for the Cecchetti Council in London, England.

A total of 183 outstanding ballet students from 11 states and Washington, D.C., participated in the conference, along with 44 teachers from 12 states.

OC Dems Endorse 5 Candidates

Five candidates for county-wide offices were endorsed by the Oakland County Democratic committee following an open meeting where candidates were invited to speak and answer questions.

Candidates winning endorsements are Thomas G. Plunkett, for reelection as prosecuting attorney; Johannes F. Spreen, former Detroit police commissioner, as sheriff; Jean W. Sallie, for clerk-reefer of deeds; James M. Brennan, for treasurer; and William M. Richards for drain commissioner.

Richards was appointed drain commissioner after Daniel Barry was convicted of conflict of interest. Brennan is county auditor.

Morley A. Wingard, chairman of the Oakland County Democratic Party said, "In all cases, the votes were overwhelmingly in favor of those endorsed."

"We hope that each voter will carefully investigate the qualifications, the background and the proposals of every candidate and consider the endorsements of every civic and political group, including ours, and then vote wisely on Tuesday, Aug. 8," he added.

4 Candidates Sign Pledge

Four Oakland County candidates have signed the "implied consent for political integrity" pledge submitted to them by a citizens group, Freedom By Involvement.

The pledge states the elected official will agree to cooperate with investigating authorities and, take a lie detector test if charges of felonious behavior arise in his office.

Signing it were Tony Renne, Democratic prosecutor candidate; Richard Kuhn, non-partisan Circuit Court judge candidate; U.S. Rep. William Bromfield (D-Royal Oak), candidate in the 19th district; and George Kuhn, Republican drain commissioner candidate.

GC To Get Twin Theaters

La Parisien Theater in downtown Garden City will soon have an identical twin. Construction will begin later this month on La Parisien No. 2, a \$200,000 project. The two will share a common lobby and form an L-shaped pattern, with No. 1 continuing to front on the south side of Ford Road and No. 2 on the east side of Middle Belt.

Completion is due sometime early in 1973, according to Charles Shafer, president of State Theaters, Inc., owner of the La Parisien No. 1 and the State-Wayne Drive-In.

Like No. 1, the new theater will have seating for 500, and the lighted parking lot will have space for 600 cars.

The twin will have the same ornate details, including rocking chair seats, wall paneling, carpeting and other interior features in the same French motif.

Designers are Martin Shafer, Charles' brother and vice president of the firm, and Martin's wife.

Charles Shafer said that No. 1 produces the largest gross box office per seat of any movie theater in the State of Michigan.

The new construction is a strong boost for the economy of downtown Garden City, where urban renewal and downtown redevelopment are strong public issues.

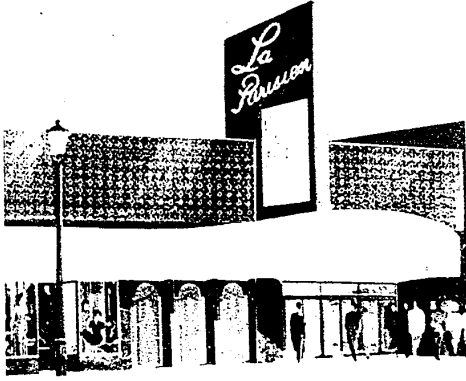
"We long ago foresaw the rapid growth of Garden City and found from experience that the people are interested in good, substantial movie entertainment. We have great confidence in the city, and city officials have been very cooperative," said Shafer.

The current La Parisien was built in 1966 on the site of the old Shafer Theater that the current owners' father built decades ago.

The Shafer brothers and their mother have been pioneers in the concept of twin theaters. Their other corporation, Wayne Amusement Co., owns the Quo Vadis entertainment center in Westland, which features four theaters, a dining room and cocktail lounge, along with the Wayne Twin Drive-In.

A twin theater, Shafer once said, adds only about 10 percent to the total operating cost of the first theater. For example, the same ticket seller and projectionist can serve two theaters.

Just where the parking will be located depends on whether the Garden City Council approves a controversial urban renewal project Monday night. Current parking is on the north side of Ford Road, across from this No. 1 theater.
