## Liquor License Denied By Board

**FARMINGTON**  
The request for a liquor license for Starboard Tack lost 3-3 Monday night before the Farmington Township Board.

Developers for the restaurant said they were planning a \$400,000 building on a site on Orchard Lake Rd., between 13 Mile Rd. and Burbank St.

But three of the trustees - Margaret Schaeffer, Fred Lichtman and Earl Oppenheimer - voted against the request. Mrs. Schaeffer said she felt the township has given out its allotment of new licenses "too fast."

Lichtman told the developers he opposed the license for two reasons: "One, I think we've got enough. And, two, I resent the pressure that has been brought to bear on us about this license." Trustees were given a brochure on the prospective business, and offered a free pass to eat at one like it in Lansing.

A seventh vote to break the tie was not available as Treasurer Thomas Nolan was absent.

Supervisor Earl Teeple said he supported the license because the restaurant would be "a quality operation."

At the same time the trustees informally agreed to take a look at all current licenses and in the case of at least one, revoke it if changes in the building were not made soon.

**TOWNSHIP ATTORNEY**  
J.T. Brennan told the trustees they could pull a liquor license "forthwith," any time they wanted to do so.

"However, recent court cases have shown judges are looking for some logical reason for taking a license away," Brennan warned.

Licenses are issued through the Michigan State Liquor Control Commission, and allocated on the basis of population census every 10 years.

In a similar action, the board trustees voted to SDM (beer and wine only) license to Raouf Harb from Mount Haidar and Allie Hider, for a store at 29970 12 Mile Rd.

## Dystrophy Carnival Planned
