# Two From Area Study In London

FARMINGTON Two Farmington residents will be among the 140 students from 61 different colleges and universities who will be studying at City of London (England) Polytechnic under the sponsorship of Beaver College's London semester program. Beaver College is in Penn.

Ellen Zuckerman, of 31040 Pointe of Woods, and David Thomas, of 32027 Bonnet Hill Rd. will leave on Aug. 19 from New York for 17 weeks of study in London.

The students will have three

weeks of orientation including an excursion to Warwick, Coventry and Oxford; sightseeing in and around London; lectures by British leaders of government, press and business, and visits to London theaters. Each student will live with a British family for a week, sharing daily experiences as a member of the family.

Classes will begin on Sept. 11. Subjects offered will be economics, fine arts, history, literature, political science, psychology, and sociology.

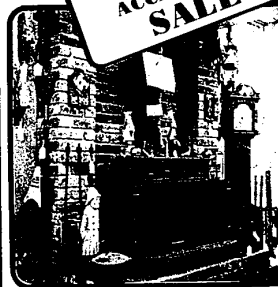

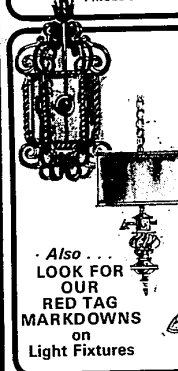

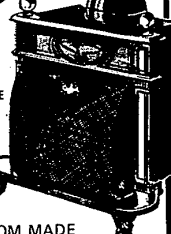
