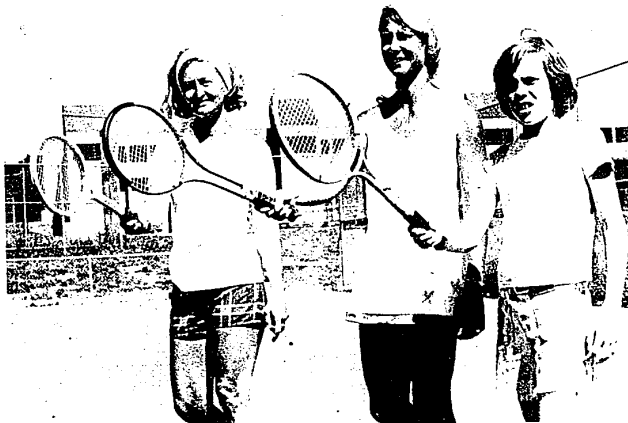

Symphony To Play 17 New Works

DETROIT Complete programs for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra's 1972-73 Thursday - Saturday concert series are now available by contacting the symphony at Ford Auditorium.

The series will include 17 works never before performed by the orchestra by composers dating from Handel to Witold Lutoslawski. Among them will be Alberto Ginastera's Harp Concerto and a complete concert performance of Manuel de Falla's opera "La Vida Breve."

Pianists Robert Casadesu, Daniel Barenboim and Vladimir Ashkenazy and violinists Henryk Szeryng and Charles Treger will make return visits as guest artists. Treger, who as a teenager was a member of the Detroit Symphony (1951-54), replaces Isaac Stern who has had to postpone his Detroit appearance until next season.

Making debut appearances will be conductors Charles Mackerras, Paul Kletzki and Aldo Ceccato, harpist Nicmar Zabaleta and pianists Garrick Ohlsson and Israela Margalit.
