Still Time To Register At S'craft

Schoolcraft College will be
accepting late registration for
the fall semester through
Tuesday, Sept. 5.

The period for late
registration has been ex-
tended by three days this
year.

Director of Admissions
Barbara Geil feels that the
extra time will enable the
college to serve more
latecomers better, and she
points out the advantage of
being able to take persons
after the Labor Day holiday,
as an added convenience.

REGISTRATIONS will be
taken daily in the Student
Affairs Building from 8:30 to
4, and from 6 to 8 for evening
classes. Persons who have a
valid reason for registering
late may do so without
penalty. Otherwise, there is a
\$10 late fee for full-time
students, and \$250 per course
for part-time students.

All persons who register
must first have been admitted
to the College or, if that has
been completed, must have
been consulted a counselor. Either
of these can be arranged by
calling the college.

Of special interest this fall,
Schoolcraft is offering evening
classes at Garden City in
business and law en-
forcement. Persons enrolling
in these classes will complete
registration on the Schoolcraft
campus, but the classes will
be meeting in Garden City
during the semester.

Regional Talk Set Aug. 30

Regionalism in the Min-
neapolis/St. Paul area of
Minnesota, one of the most
progressive regional
movements in the U.S., is the
discussion paper and topic on
Aug. 30 (next Wednesday) at 8
p.m. for the fifth in a series of
regional governance public
seminars in southeast
Michigan.

Macomb County Com-
munity College's South
Campus on 12 Mile Road
between Groesbeck and
Schoenherr Roads is the
meeting site. Meeting room is
the Auditorium of the "S
Building" on the South
Campus.

A panel of area citizens will
react at the seminar to the
Metropolitan Fund year-long
series of twelve discussion
papers exploring the poten-
tials of regional governance in
the United States.

TED KOLDERIE, author of
this paper, is executive
director of the Citizens League
in the Twin Cities area. His
directorship of the league, a
non-profit regional affairs
agency provides the per-
spective from which he
touches the history, structure
and function of regionalism in
the Twin Cities area.

This is paper number five
and the first metropolitan
area case study in the
Metropolitan Fund year-long
series of twelve discussion
papers exploring the poten-
tials of regional governance in
the United States.

There is no admission
charge for the seminar, open
to the public. Audience par-
ticipation is encouraged in a
question and answer period
following the panel discussion.
Summaries of the seminar
paper will be available at the
meeting.

CP Rate Hike Hearing Set

LANSING
Public hearings on an ap-
plication by Consumers Power
Co. of Jackson for authority to
increase its rates by \$56
million annually will start on
Sept. 11, the Michigan Public
Service Commission an-
nounced.

The commission also an-
nounced that it will hold
hearings Sept. 20 and 21 on the
utility's request for a \$34.2
million interim rate increase.
Consumers Power has asked
that the interim rate increase
be put into effect immediately
pending a final decision on its
application for a \$56 million
rate hike.
