



CP Rate Hike **Hearing Set**

Public hearings on an ap-plication by Consumers Power Co. of Jackson for authority to increase its rates by \$56 million annually will start on Sept. 11, the Michigan Public Service Commission an-nounced.

The commission also announced that it will hold hearings Sepl. 20 and 21 on the utility's request for a \$42.0 million interim rate increase. Consumers Power has asked that the interim rate increase be put into effect immediately pending a final decision on its application for a \$56 million rate hike.
