FARMINGTON LIBRARY BENEFIT

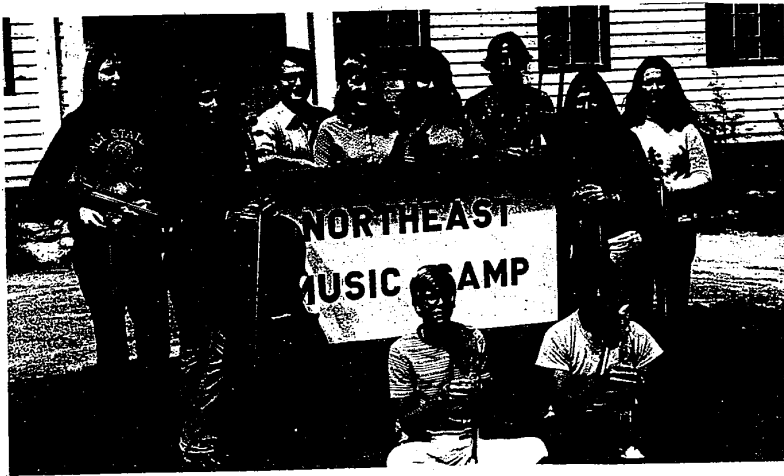
