

Muddy To Give Concert

Blues singer and guitarist Muddy Waters will give a concert at 8 p.m., Wednesday, Oct. 4, in the L.E. Schmidt Auditorium of Clarencville High School, Middle Belt Road, north of Seven Mile, Livonia.

Waters is being presented by Schoolcraft College's Artes Productions, formerly known as the student activities board.

TICKETS ARE priced at \$3 for the general public and \$2 for Schoolcraft students. They



are available at the student activities office. Muddy Waters was born McKinley Morganfield on April 4, 1915, in Rolling Fork, Miss. During the early years of World War II, he recorded for the Library of Congress, principally singing and playing country Delta blues. Among his hit tunes are

"I'm Your Hoochie Koochie Man," "Got My Mojo Working," "Long Distance Call," "Baby, Please Don't Go" and "Honey Bee."

Until the mid-1950s, the music of Muddy Waters and his fellow bluesmen was marketed as "race music" and aimed almost exclusively at black communities.

TODAY HIS audience is largely young whites. Muddy makes numerous college appearances each year, and he plays mostly in white clubs and theaters.

Muddy says "Young whites are more responsive." He adds that "the blacks are more interested in the jumpy stuff. The whites want to hear me for what I am."

When asked about the white rock groups like the Rolling Stones who have made a lot of money with his songs, Muddy says, "I don't ever give it a thought...if they had never started taking my stuff, I don't know that I could have moved up financially."

PAMELA WENZEL of Westland plays Billie Dawn, the chorus girl, and Gary Serlin of Livonia plays Harry Brock, the crooked junkman, in "Born Yesterday." The Garson Kanin comedy will be staged by the Masque Players Sept. 28-Oct. 1 in the Liberal Arts Theater, Schoolcraft College, 18600 Haggerty, Livonia. Curtain time is at 8 the first three evenings and at 7 Sunday evening. Tickets will be on sale at the door.
