Mrs. Cox Writes On Greenery One-Year Pact Seen At C'ville

Clarenceville residents this month should have special interest in "Michigan Out-Of-Doors," the official publication of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs. Mrs. Dorothy Cox, sixth grade teacher at Westbrook Elementary School in the district, has contributed an article to a new section of the magazine which is devoted to making Michigan beautiful and clean. The section is entitled "Keep It Green" and Mrs. Cox article "Teacher Tips."

The veil of secrecy over the Clarenceville School District teacher contract was accidentally lifted a crack early this week.

Supt. David McDowell, in preparing the board of education's agenda, referred to it as the "1972-73 contract," indicating it is a one-year pact.

Earlier, district administrators and representatives of the faculty union had pledged to keep terms of the biggest item in the school budget a secret until ratification.

Except for that one example, not even the broad outlines of the new contract with the Clarenceville Education Assn. have been revealed since bargaining teams reached agreement two weeks ago.

The veil will be lifted Thursday when the board of education votes on ratification, but the public will have to wait until late in the evening. McDowell placed the item last on a 19-item agenda.

McDowell will also ask the board to set Oct. 26 for first reading of the district's budget and Nov. 9 for a public hearing.

In other business Thursday, the school board will consider auto shop bids, a hazardous ceiling condition in the board office, replacement of the south kindergarten walls at Grandview Elementary School and replacement of 93 lockers in the junior high.
