

SC Gets \$540 In Gifts And Car

The Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees accepted \$540 in gifts to the college recently along with donation of a 1972 Chevrolet station wagon which was damaged this summer as a result of the flooding caused by hurricane Agnes.

Included in the donations was a \$100 gift from sophomore Moira Sucher, who is in the nursing associate degree program. Miss Sucher donated the money for purchase of equipment that will benefit the nursing students. The Associate Degree Nursing Alumni Assn. donated \$200 for the establishment of a nursing alumni grant.

Mayflower Post 6695 of the Veterans of Foreign Wars donated \$200 to be deposited in the college's scholarship fund. General Motors Corp. donated the flood-damaged station wagon to the automotive program of Schoolcraft.

A number of new vehicles had been water-damaged during the flood and couldn't be marketed so the company donated several of them to instructional institutions.

Schoolcraft President C. Nelson Grote said the new automobile will be valuable in the automotive program because it has new emission control systems, load levers, air conditioning and many new accessories and equipment.
