

Shirley Chisholm Will Speak At Symposium

Congresswoman Shirley Chisholm of New York will highlight a two-day symposium on "The American Woman" Oct. 20 and 21 in Mount Clemens.

Rep. Chisholm will speak on "The Status of Women" at 8 p.m., Friday, in the Mount Clemens High School Auditorium, 155 Cass. A reception and dinner will precede her talk and a public reception will follow at the high school.

SCHEDULED To lead symposium discussions Saturday are Lorraine Beebe, chairwoman of the Michigan Women's Commission; Jane Hart and Dr. Ethelene J. Crockett, prominent women activists; Mildred Jeffrey of the United Auto Workers; Ely M. Petersen, former chairman of the Michigan Republican Party; and Dr. Bette C. White, associate dean

of students of Eastern Michigan University. Saturday's program will begin at 9:30 a.m. in Grace Episcopal Church, 115 S. Gratiot, Mount Clemens. Tickets for the two-day program are \$10. Tickets for Friday evening only are \$3.

These include, besides Grace Church, the League of Women Voters, the United Auto Workers, the Welfare Rights Organization and the National Organization for Women.

New School Operating For Pregnant Girls

A school made necessary by a new state law is now operating in First United Methodist Church of Garden City, 6443 Merriman.

The school is for pregnant high school girls who do not wish to attend their regular high school classes, but at the same time don't want to drop out of school.

Up to this year high school girls who were pregnant could have a teacher come to their homes and tutor them.

BUT UNDER the new state law, it became illegal for the schools to provide this service on the grounds that pregnancy couldn't be considered a special education handicap.

The law does make provision for an alternative program, and this is what is now in successful operation in Garden City.

Here the girls receive individualized attention from two teachers, plus counseling and child care information from nurses from the Wayne County Health Department.

The new school was set up and is directed by Margaret Naumes, director of special education and special education services in Garden City.

Since its opening in September, it has had a fluctuating enrollment of between 17 and 22. Two of its students have had their babies, but will return to the special school until the end of the semester when they will re-enter their regular school programs.

designed to serve Plymouth, Wayne, Redford Union, Livonia, and Romulus school districts as well as Garden City.

The state pays up to \$8,100 for each teacher's salary, and the local school boards pay other expenses, such as rental of the church's facilities, on a proportionate basis.

The program was set up during the summer by Wayne County school officials, who felt that the Garden City church offered the needed space.

The planning committee was advised by a state consultant that it seemed better to have the girls attend classes outside a regular school building.

Some districts are offering transportation to and from the church. In others, the students must provide their own.

More teachers will be hired if they are needed, and it is planned to bring in special teachers for special subjects as the program tries to meet the needs and the wants of the individual.

Actually the program is open to any girl or woman in the community who is pregnant and who has not completed high school. Interested persons may contact their local school counselors.
