



C'ville Exec Pay Boosted

Administrative salary increases, including a \$2,000 pay hike for Supt. David McDowell, were approved by the Clarenceville Board of Education Thursday.

The superintendent's 7.4 per cent pay increase, from \$27,000 to \$29,000, follows terms of a three-year contract.

The salary of Asst. Supt. James Leary was boosted from \$24,500 to \$26,000, or about 6 per cent, also under terms of a three-year contract.

Two-year contracts were awarded Business Manager Ed. Salisz, increasing his salary from \$20,300 to \$21,500, and to the administrative assistant, Harold Humble. Humble's pay goes from \$19,500 to \$20,700.

THE BOARD said reports of the Detroit Metropolitan Bureau of School Studies would indicate the new salaries are in accord with similarly sized school districts in the Detroit metropolitan area.

The board took under consideration possible construction of a field house at the athletic field adjacent to the junior high school, at an estimated cost of \$150,000. The field house would include locker and shower facilities for athletes and a storage area.

The board also changed the date of its Dec. 14 meeting to Dec. 7 because the original date conflicted with the all-school concert.

Members of the Broadcasters Club at the High School petitioned the board to consider installation in the high school of a 10-watt FM radio station.

The board asked further study be undertaken by the high school administrators and broadcasters before a decision is made.

Can You Get 'Hooked' On One Shot Of Heroin?

Q. Can you get hooked on heroin by using it just once?

A. How about twice? The first experience, as with that very first cigarette, is generally distinctly unpleasant. But, as with cigarettes, many individuals have a strong urge to try it again "just once."

There is just no way that a single shot of heroin can cause an addiction. But please remember that an addiction is defined as a condition producing profound withdrawal symptoms. And a one-time use will not produce withdrawal.

There is, however, a very critical distinction between being addicted and being "hooked." A number of addicts have said years later something like "Man, after that first fix I knew that no way was I going to walk away from that junk — ever."

At that point they were not addicted, but the compulsion to return to what was — for them — an extremely pleasurable experience became virtually irresistible. The actual addiction took place some weeks or, more likely, months later. And at this later time withdrawal would occur if the drug were stopped. The individual then is a full-blown "junkie"; he not merely desires to shoot up again — he feels physically ill if he doesn't.

Q. Can you become addicted to tranquilizers even if they're prescribed by your doctor?

A. This is possible, although not very likely. A lot depends on the individual, on the type of tranquilizer, on the amount used and on the duration of use.

The first thing to do is discuss this with your physician. He can tell you if the medication you are taking could lead to such a condition. Many tranquilizers have a addiction liability whatsoever.

Perhaps the most important thing you could do would be to take a look at yourself and the way you use tranquilizers. Do you tend on occasion to take more of this medication at a

time or per day than your physician directed? Do you tend to feel insecure if your supply of the drug runs out? Have you fallen into a pattern of turning to a tranquilizer first before attempting to resolve your tensions and problems by yourself?

If there is any indication that you fall into this pattern, there is a possibility that you could be — to one degree or another — addiction-prone. This should be frankly discussed with your physician. He can make sure that you are given a tranquilizer not likely to cause dependence. More importantly, he can discuss with you safe patterns of use. Fortunately, although many of us need tranquilizers at one time or another, not many need them as a steady diet to get by. As with so many other things, less is better and least is best. But never either increase or decrease the usage without your physician's guidance.
