

2 Hearing Impaired Students Are Speakers

A girl from Livonia and a boy from Garden City, both with hearing handicaps, will be among the speakers at a meeting of the Greater Detroit Assn. for the Oral Education of the Hearing Impaired next week.

Sally Lambert, a senior, and Richard Davis, a junior, are both enrolled in the program for the hearing handicapped at Redford Union High School. They will talk about their early training in oral communication and their RU classes, then answer questions when the association meets Thursday, Nov. 16, at 8 p.m. in Keeler Elementary School, 17715 Brady, Redford Township.

TRAINING in oral education began in pre-school years and continued in elementary and junior high school. Miss Lambert and Davis now attend regular classes with hearing students at Redford Union High School. Both plan to attend college. Miss Lambert, whose hearing loss is severe, hopes

to enter the business world. Typing, bookkeeping and English are among her classes at Redford Union, and she is a member of a bowling league outside school. She entered Redford Union's pre-school program for children with hearing handicaps when she was six, and later attended the Lutheran School for the Deaf for four years. She has been enrolled in RU programs since 1965.

CLASSES on Davis' schedule include chemistry, world history, geometry, English and physical education. In spite of his hearing impairment, which is classified as moderate, Davis is on the wrestling team and a member of the RU Ski Club. He began pre-school training when he was five at Henry Ruff Elementary School in Garden City, and continued in oral and general education in Redford Union Schools.

They will interview the professional speaker for the

meeting and introduce her. She is Mrs. E. Jane Daniels, teacher at the Lutheran School for the Deaf, who is also the mother of a profoundly deaf son. Her topic will be "Language for Parents." Mrs. Daniels has been a teacher at the Central Institute for the Deaf in St. Louis and Detroit Day School for the Deaf. She and her husband were missionaries in the Republic of China from 1945 to 1952.

MRS. DANIELS speaks in favor of oral education for hearing handicapped students, not only as a teacher but as the mother of a 21-year-old profoundly deaf son, who attended the Central Institute for the deaf, later graduated from a regular program in a hearing high school, and received a degree at the University of Detroit. He is now a coach at Lutheran School for the Deaf.

The Greater Detroit Assn. for the Oral Education of the Hearing Impaired includes parents, teachers and interested friends in the three-county Detroit metropolitan area, who believe that all hearing handicapped persons deserve an oral education to go along in a hearing society.

President of the one-year-old association is Mark Reeve of Grosse Pointe Park, a teacher at the Lutheran School for the Deaf. Publicizing the program in the Western Wayne County area will be members of "Help Us Hear," parents of children in the Redford Union Garden City Program for Hearing Impaired Students, of which Art Wornack is president.
