



Hazel Skerrett Honored

The Annapolis Hospital Auxiliary goes into its 15th year of service to the Dearborn hospital with 12 of its charter members, including Hazel Skerrett and Katherine Hickey of Westland, still active volunteers.

Mrs. Skerrett was one of those on hand as the auxiliary marked its anniversary with a salad luncheon in the hospital Oct. 19. Since the auxiliary was formed, she has given the hospital 802 hours of service.

The membership meeting, attended by 56 of the current members, also included a short business session led by president Mary Morgan and a talk by Walter S. Wheeler, hospital superintendent, on "Medicine of the Future."

THE AUXILIARY held its first membership tea in September of 1958 with 300 charter members.

Over the years, volunteer members have contributed some 10,202 hours of service in such capacities as working in the admitting office, taking baby photos, feeding patients, passing out water and juices, transporting patients and delivering mail and flowers.

The first director of volunteers, Jean Rothrock, was named in 1963, and Ruth Long now holds that position.

The auxiliary gift shop began with a few shelves in 1965, and two years later had grown so rapidly that a chairman was appointed as a permanent board member.

PLANS BEGAN for a chapel in the hospital in 1966, and two years later the auxiliary was able to contribute complete furnishings for the room.

Some of the other hospital additions made possible through auxiliary contributions are flowering crab trees for the grounds, an operating room humidifier, a flag, delivery cart, hot peck machine, tilt table, parallel bars, cardiac monitor and defibrillator, circo electric bed, public address system, isotope and oxygen tent.

The group also has contributed to an EKG machine, heart monitors, heart-lung resuscitators, a camera for hospital records and has made a \$4,000 contribution towards an auto-analyzer for the laboratory.
