Dolomite Rock 'Made' At MSU

EAST LANSING A Michigan State University doctoral candidate has successfully "made" a dolomite rock in a laboratory for the first time.

Miss Patricia Orr devised a "recipe" calling for finely ground dolomite and 10 batches of sea water of various concentrations.
Dolomite is primarily composed of the deteriorated shells of marine animals, and geologists feel a greater knowledge of how the rock is formed will help them discover buried fossil fuel deposits.
