Bond Elementary Librarian Dies

Funeral services for Mrs. Peggy Paskovitz, a media specialist at Bond and Fairview elementary schools, were held Saturday in her native Indiana. Mrs. Paskovitz, 44, died unexpectedly Nov. 15 at Pine School in Bloomfield Hills and before that in the Madison school district. Friends said she became ill after attending a night meeting at the school administration office. She had gone to her car but returned to the building complaining of a headache, they said. She lay down but grew increasingly ill and was taken to the hospital where she died a few days later. Mrs. Paskovitz, who lived at 5547 Normanhurst, West Bloomfield, joined the Farmington public schools last September. Prior to that she had been librarian at Lone Pine School in Bloomfield Hills and before that in the Madison school district. Mrs. Paskovitz is survived by her husband, Jerome; three children, Andrew, Robin and Amy; Tousey, her parents, Mr. and Mrs. George Willcox of North Manchester, Ind.; and two sisters, Mrs. Georgianna Halliday and taken to the hospital where she died a few days later.

Garbage Contract Rate Is Changed

FARMINGTON In OTHER business, the contract with McCreedy Trucking, Inc., the company which provides collection services for the City of Farmington, has been increased \$500 a month, for a total of \$3,000 per year by the city council. The council authorized the increase to cover unanticipated cost increases in the contract, including insurance premiums and an 18 per cent increase in the number of stops, according to a report submitted to the council.

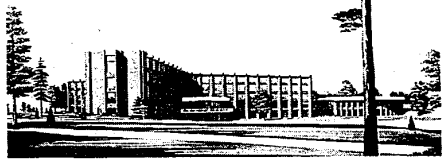
