Students Take Gothic Trip

DETROIT
 Students from Farmington High School recently took a trip to Detroit to see some of its historic sites.

With the cooperation of New Detroit, the humanities classes of John Barrett and Miss Rita Peiron went to Detroit to visit the historic church sites of the community along with a trip to the colorful Eastern Market.

THE TRIP was inspired by studies in the humanities classes of architecture and how it relates to people.

After hearing a lecture on the history of the churches to be visited, the students started their tour at St. Annes, the oldest parish in Detroit, located near the Ambassador Bridge.

The French Gothic architecture, with high rising spires, is complemented by the ornate interior. The magnificent structure is the eighth building of St. Annes, the first of which was constructed in 1701 within Fort Cadillac.

The church prides itself in having relics of St. Anne's seventh structure, built in 1828.

THE MARINER'S Church was the next on the itinerary. This stout Gothic revival structure is the oldest stone church surviving in Detroit. It was first built as a sailors' mission.

From Mariner's Church the group went on to view the old and new architecture of central Detroit while enroute to St. Josephs Church.

This German Gothic structure is tall and stately with soaring frontal tower. Its steep roof and tall windows add to the height of the structure.

This limestone church is the

last in a cycle of Detroit's native limestone churches.

THE SWEETEST Heart of Mary Church was the final structure to be viewed by the students.

Although the twin towers suggest the Gothic architecture of northern Europe, the rest of the red brick structure shows many different styles.

The ornate interior consists of a huge white marble altar surrounded by statues and large stained glass windows. The ceiling is painted with religious scenery.

During the course of the trip the group stopped at Eastern Market for lunch. Time was allowed for browsing as well as to experience the market's circus-like atmosphere.

The directory offers a media for low cost advertising for Farmington merchants. A Jaycee survey indicates that 50 per cent of the residents retain and use the directory throughout the year.

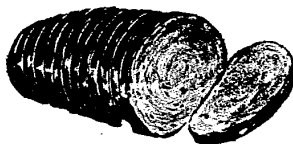
Design of the directory will be a Yellow Pages format to
