

Burn Prevention Class Launched At McIntyre

LATHRUP VILLAGE An attack on burns, the nation's third largest accidental killer, has been launched in the McIntyre Elementary School of Southfield School District, by the Junior Division of the Jewish Welfare Federation.

Burnie Bird, symbol of the campaign, introduced the program to students from kindergarten through third grade at a special assembly on Monday.

The program, created by a team of school teachers, is intended to involve maximum pupil participation through role playing, worksheets, and creative activities.

Children will be urged to act out, write out, or tell stories about potentially hazardous situations revolving around coffee cups, frying pans and hot stoves.

According to pediatric burn statistics, the kitchen is the most dangerous room in the house as far as burn injuries are concerned. Bathrooms are the next most dangerous.

cluding a first-aid sheet, a home safety checklist, and peeloff stickers to mark household trouble spots.

Following the pilot program, which ends Dec. 1, the creators will meet with parents and teachers of students to determine the effectiveness of the program.

Groundwork and direction for the program were supervised in part by Mrs. Robert Levy of Southfield in cooperation with Dr. James Lloyd, head of Children's Hospital of Michigan burn unit.
