And the editor of the Holly Herald has discovered Old Bill Shiftless over there. No wonder I haven't been able to get an interview lately.

And one discovers after a few minutes conversation with Hon. Samuel W. Smith that Farmington, the township and the county have a mighty good friend in congress.

The Pontiac Press Gazette of Tuesday says: "A woman, apparently a Swede, was found wandering naked yesterday near Richouski," etc. That word "apparently" looks a trifle racy for a staid old publication like the Gazette.

In the general run of the work of the editor of a newspaper, be it big or little, there is bound to come a certain amount of unpleasantness, in a score or more of ways. In the case of a small country paper such as the majority of those in Oakland county, outside the county seat, where the duties of editor-publisher evolves upon the shoulders of one man who must make a livelihood from that source alone it often develops doubly hard, as he is often compelled to speak in a vein that leads his reader to believe that the expression comes from owner instead of editor. Be it understood then, dear reader, that this expression of what you may term disapproval comes from me as editor and not from publisher. The cry of the country is to support the business man who lives and spends his money in your home town—to eliminate as far as possible the mail order houses—to put and leave everything possible in your home town. The one individual or rather institution that SHOULD realize and study and promote this idea is the public schools. The commencement programs for the local high school have just been issued, and the work no better or no worse than could have been done right here at home. The price we are unfamiliar with, but it is reasonable to suppose that a home man would grant at least as large a concession to home folks, and graduates at that, as could be obtained out of the town or county.

The fact remains that the article was imported from outside, with out a thought of one of the biggest ideas of the country, today, the patronage of home industry. As editor we feel that every business man should know the facts. As publisher or owner we feel the slight. I can only hope that this article is sufficiently timely to prevent its repetition to the later detriment and regret not only of other local business houses and supporters of the public school, but of Farmington high school and its officials.
