

Big Christmas Project Gets Gifts To Forgotten

A mighty Christmas project at Northville State Hospital, involving staff, volunteers and many givers of gifts, makes certain that society's "forgotten" people are remembered at the holiday. As a result, gaily-wrapped packages are going to several hundred forgotten and indigent patients - some in the hospital, some in family care and nursing homes and some who have left the hospital program.

"Just because they're off our lists, it doesn't automatically mean they have friends to think of them at Christmas," said Louis J. Schult, NSH community relations director.

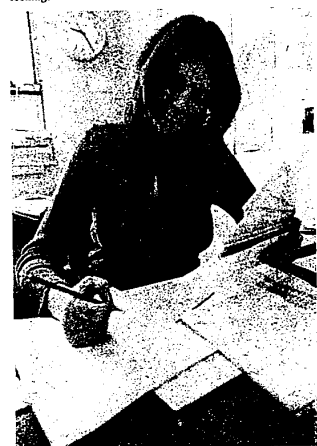
THERE WERE gifts for 477 patients and ex-patients when Mrs. George H. Johnson and Mrs. Marcus Arthur, volunteers from Plymouth, came in Monday to help wrap and sort presents with Mrs. Jean Bachelder, coordinator of volunteer services. They came from individuals and organizations who received the names of specific patients and information on his age, size and particular needs and desires.

But that's only part of the Christmas story at Northville State Hospital.

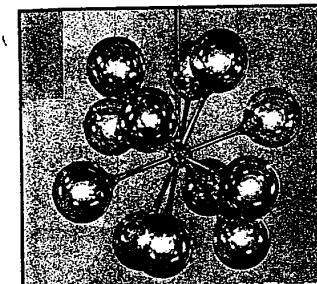
Besides the individual gifts, many groups of employees in area businesses and sorority and church groups have sent checks for use by the hospital for its patients' benefit.

Schult said he keeps track of these gifts and sends to all the organizations an accounting of purchases over the past year from such funds. Some organizations also check with hospital leaders to find out needs of wards or other groups of patients and make gifts of this type.

Donated in the last year through this means have been a tape recorder, athletic needs for the young adult unit, camping equipment and pots and pans for women patients who wanted to do some cooking.

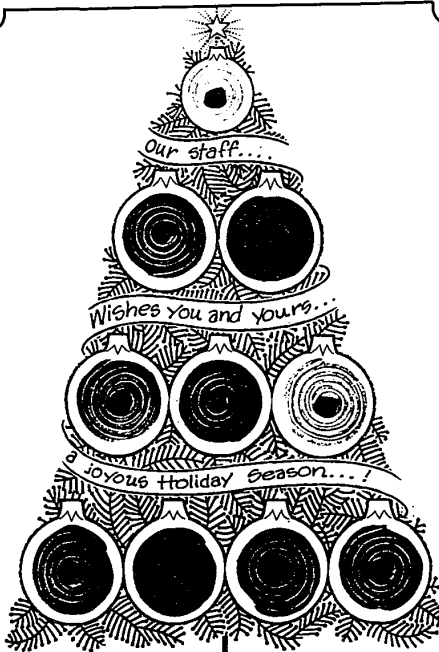
