### Handicapped League Needs New Facility

The Goodwill Industries branch of League for the Handicapped, located at Newburgh and Ann Arbor Trail in Livonia, is looking for a new building in the northwest area. The old school building it currently occupies can't be renovated or improved.

Persons who know of a suitable location can contact William Ebert at the Livonia branch.

The program, partially supported by the Michigan Dept. of Mental Health and the Torch Drive, has 20 clients and nine employees, including Mrs. Julia Harvey of Garden City and Carolyn Jensen of Southfield.

Clients participate in arts and crafts, gardening, ceramics and assist with cafeteria and maintenance work.

### Classes Include 'Cholesterol Diets'

Registration is under way for low cholesterol dieting and 59 other classes in community services at Schoolcraft College. The registration period will continue through Jan. 26.

A registered dietician, Mrs. Kathy Crossman of Northville, will teach diet which is being offered for the first time.

It is for persons interested in low-cholesterol dieting as a preventive measure, or for those presently on a diet prescribed by their physician. The class will meet from 7-10 p.m. Wednesdays, beginning Feb. 7.

DR. CARLOS Godoy, a Livonia cardiologist, will present the medical aspects of heart disease. Films and other class materials will be furnished by the Wayne County Heart Assn.

Mrs. Crossman is a volunteer worker with the association.

Registration for the diet class may be completed by mail or on campus during the mornings. Forms and other information may be obtained from the community services office.

Schoolcraft is offering more than 60 community services classes for the winter semester. Tuition for most is \$11 for residents and \$22 for non-residents.

The college is located on Haggerty at Seven Mile in Livonia. Its resident area includes the school districts of Clawsonville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville and Plymouth.

## SC Staffs 3 Programs

Schoolcraft College has appointed three new staff members to head special programs for women and senior citizens, and to direct the operation of the information and service center at Garden City.

Funding for the three new positions was made possible by a one-year state grant to the college.

WOMEN'S continuum activities will be directed by Nancy Dufour who holds a bachelor's degree in psychology and a master's in guidance and counseling. Before coming to Schoolcraft she was employed as a counselor with the Michigan Employment Securities Commission.

Mrs. Dufour said she plans to study the needs of women in the college community in order to design new programs to meet their needs. She hopes to foster the idea of life-long growth for women through continued education.

She also will acquaint women with new career opportunities, especially in jobs traditionally open only to men.

BETTY ANDREWS is directing the new senior adult affairs program. A recent graduate of the Institute of Gerontology of the University of Michigan and Wayne State University, she holds a specialist's degree in aging. Mrs. Andrews, of Plymouth, participated in the community survey and pilot retirement studies programs sponsored by Schoolcraft College Foundation and the Institute of Gerontology.

Primary goals listed by Mrs. Andrews include developing a comprehensive program, both informational and educational, for the older adults in the college community, and continuation of the retirement studies programs conducted in Livonia and Northville.

THE NEW MAN at Schoolcraft's information and service center in Garden City is Stuart C. Baker.

Baker is a community college graduate and holds a bachelor's degree from Western Michigan University.






